Good Friday Cross Walk

Why carry a cross on Good Friday? I suspect there are as many reasons as there are people. For me, it's a symbolic reminder that this work to which I am called, radical and extravagant love and grace...well it could cost me everything and Jesus is still asking, "Are you in despite what it could cost you?" Jesus never once backed down, never once stopped loving, never once stopped reaching out to those his culture excluded. He never stopped. God is so much bigger than our definition of God. And God's love for all humankind is so much bigger than our definition of love.

Sometimes, oftentimes, living into love and grace for all, speaking up for truth...it's not popular and it's just hard.

I'll be helping to carry the cross on Good Friday not to show off or define myself as Christian. I'll be carrying it because it's hard, because I don't know what others might think or how I'll even be received, because I choose to take my place in this Body...even when it's hard. And perhaps it will help me remember that I'm called to do hard things the next time loving someone else doesn't feel easy. Perhaps it will remind me that I have a voice when someone being marginalized doesn't. Perhaps it will remind me that I both worship, love and am loved by someone who spent his whole life in service to others even when it resulted in his death on that cross.

I imagine it will be all those things and more but I pray it will remind me more deeply of my call to extravagant grace and radical love no matter the cost.

As we move more deeply into Lent and prepare for Holy Week and Easter, I have been reflecting on our growing times of silence in worship. Many of you have reached out to share with me how meaningful this practice has been for you. It has been for me too. We live in a cacophony of noisy distraction in this modern world of ours, much of it by our own choosing. For all of our instant access we have often sacrificed the gentleness of quiet moments. I'd also like to invite you to lean in to the quiet moments you can find in your own life as you prepare for Easter.

As always, I'm here. If you want to check in, take a walk or enjoy some silence with another soul, it would be my honor to share the time with you as we together continue in this journey and this art of being church.

Deacon's Letter

Turning numbers into individuals can turn fear and hate into love and compassion. I stood on the corner at the Vashon stop light last month as part of a silent vigil to honor both our Vashon Syrian Muslims and the people of Christ Church, New Zealand. Just standing on a street corner for half an hour may not seem like a big deal but it can change both the people on the corner as well as the many people in cars driving by. Some of us were strangers to each other, but as we chatted quietly it was a chance to get to know others that I might not otherwise meet. I was a bit nervous about being on that corner but now I wish all of you could have joined us. Hate is so often motivated by fear and here I was surrounded by adults and children of different religions and ethnicities. And I was amazed, watching the cars driving by, at the diversity of the people in the cars. On this island we are very lucky to live in close quarters with people of different races and religions. That gives us a chance for people who might be different from us to become individuals and not just faceless numbers of "evil" or "destructive" others. Hate is truly not welcome here. As you make contact with people who are different from you will discover that they are not so different after all but have many of the same hopes and fears that you have. We have a loving God who loves all people. And so, if we want to be vessels through which God's love can freely flow out to a crying and battered world then we must take the time to see people as individuals and not numbers. No matter what society might say, there is no "other". There is only us and "hate is not welcome here."

SCREENING OF ANGST, THE MOVIE

According to the surgeon general, one in 5 Americans experiences a mental disorder in any given year and half of all Americans have such disorders at sometime in their lives. One in ten children/youth has a serious mental illness condition. Do I have your attention?

On Saturday, May 18th, from 9am to noon, VPC will present the movie ANGST, which deals with anxiety (and other mental disorders) in children and young adults. It is a powerful movie that everyone should see to better understand and to respond to those experiencing it, whether adult or young person. The movie is narrated largely by young people and how they experience anxiety in their daily life. There will be discussion following the movie. Admission is free and light refreshments will be served. Please plan to attend this event. (movie is 60 minutes in duration). Having seen this movie, I can tell you it is VERY worthwhile. What's on Your Mind.....

My Morning at Mercer Island Presbyterian Church

I was missing from the worship service with the Methodist Church on Sunday morning as I had been invited by Rev Binh Nguyen to attend worship at Mercer Island Presbyterian Church as the head of the clinic (sister Anna Nguyen, no relation to Binh).in Hue, Viet Nam would be there speaking about the clinic. It was so good to see Binh and Glo and Dale (a few among the others we had traveled with to Viet Nam in 2005). Binh sends his warmest regards to his sisters and brothers at Vashon Presbyterian Church.

The Kim Long Charity Clinic was founded in 1992 and has been running continuously since then. We were told today that the land it sits on has been leased all this time and now the owners wish to sell it and they must leave. That's the bad news. The Good news is that there is a German nonprofit (MISEREOR) that will foot 70% of the cost (\$1.6 million dollars) to build a new clinic, so they just need to raise \$450,000. This current clinic sees 450 patients each week at the clinic site. 18,000 patients have had dental care through the clinic. 15,000 patients who live in remote area have benefitted by a mobile unit. The clinic provides much-needed support for those with HIV/AIDS as well as nurturing the families of those with HIV/AIDS in an attempt to stop the stigma that still exists there.

Binh spoke of the blessing that financial support has meant for the scholarship program for girls in Viet Nam. The scholarships support children from elementary school and higher, including college. They find that the communities where children and especially girls get an education has great impact on the family of that student as well as the whole community. It breaks the cycle of poverty and provides hope and economic improvement of the community.
